The first three courses in the Institute of Kinlein Program of Study, Stoas I, II, III, provided the theoretical foundation for entering Stoa IV, the Professional Practice Discipline of Kinlein.

Concepts from Stoas I, II, II, Philosophy Applied in Living Life, the Theory of Moesca, and Human Relationships Through Life, are integrated throughout all courses in the Program of Study.

In Stoa IV, the focus of study is the practice dimension of the profession. The student will have the opportunity to learn assisting a person in moving in esca in appointments with clients and in community settings. This assisting is the Practice of Kinlein.

Following the POS 600 series, is POS 700 Praxis, an individual guided learning with certified kinleiners. Learning experiences are designed by student request and faculty suggestion.

STOA IV is taught as six individual courses plus a one-year Praxis. Dimensions of assisting persons in moving in esca can be learned in a variety of settings such as:

- * Office appointments with clients
- * Personal employment situations
- * Community service activities
- * Everyday interactions

Class times are interactive and directed toward integrating skill in assisting persons in moving in esca. New material is presented by means of classroom teaching, individual and group assignments, and in-classroom student presentations. Individualized one-on-one assistance with faculty is available and encouraged.

Praxis (POS700) is a one-year student-led, teacher-guided practicum. Learning experiences are designed by student request and faculty suggestion.

Upon successful completion of the entire Program of Study, graduates are eligible to sit for the Examination for Certification by the American Kinlein Association.
